# 2+2 Articulation Agreement for Anne Arundel Community College (AACC) and Towson University

**Associate's Degree:** A.S. in Business Administration Transfer **Bachelor's Degree:** B.S. in Business Administration

**Effective Term:** Fall 2020

## **Section 1: Course Completion Plan for AACC**

This section outlines the courses to take for the AACC general education (GER) and program requirements in order to complete the AACC and TU degrees within 120 credits. These tables do not include nontransferable or prerequisite coursework outside of the curriculum.

Completing the courses in Table 1 will satisfy the general education program at AACC. TU will transfer these courses without a course-by-course match to the Core Curriculum requirements. See section 2 for details.

Students may transfer a maximum of 64 credits. If students do not adhere to the courses outlined above in Tables 1 and 2, they are not guaranteed completion of the bachelor's degree in within 120 units. Refer to section 2 for specific course details and transfer planning information.

#### Section 2: AACC Course Selection Details

This section explains course selections made in section 1 and provides transfer planning guidance specific to this degree plan. If students do not complete courses outlined in this agreement, they must complete outstanding requirements at TU.

#### **GENERAL EDUCATION**

Students must note the following general education requirements:

- Diversity Requirement: Students must select an approved diversity course for their second Arts & Humanities or Social & Behavioral Science course in order to satisfy AACC degree requirements.
- Arts & Humanities: Students must complete their second Arts & Humanities GER course in a subject other than COM in order to meet AACC degree requirements.
- Social & Behavioral Sciences: Students must complete their second Social & Behavioral Sciences GER course in a subject other than ECO in order to meet AACC degree requirements.

The following information explains the transfer of students' general education program:

- TU will recognize the courses in Table 1 (see section 1) as a completed general education program. Students will receive a core package that satisfies most of the TU Core Curriculum without the need for course-by-course placement in specific Core Curriculum requirements.
- Students will only need to complete two Core Curriculum requirements at TU: Advanced Writing Seminar (Core 9) and Ethical Perspectives (Core 14). If an ethics is taken for the non-COM Arts & Humanities course at AACC, students will complete a different requirement than Core 14.

#### **BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION MAJOR SCREENING INFORMATION**

The BUAD major is a screened program. This agreement is designed for students to be able to gain admission into the major in their first semester at TU and complete any major concentration/track in four semesters of full-time enrollment. To screen into the major, students must meet the following requirements:

- 1. Formal admission to TU as a degree candidate
- 2. Cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 2.00 or higher for all course work
- 3. Grade equivalent of 2.00 or higher in each course required for admission to the BUAD major
- 4. Minimum average GPA of 2.70 for ALL of the courses required for admission to the BUAD major:
  - ACCT 201 Financial Accounting
  - ECON 201 Microeconomic Principles
  - ECON 202 Macroeconomic Principles
  - LEGL 225 Legal Environment of Business
  - ECON 205 Statistics for Business & Economics
  - MATH 211 Calculus for Applications

Students following this agreement will automatically satisfy requirements number 1 and 2. Students must monitor their grade achievement in each AACC course listed above in order to meet requirements numbers 3 and 4.

- A cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 2.0 is required.
- 32 units of the bachelor's degree must be completed at the upper level (courses numbered 300 or above).
